GEKDC background:

Korea joined the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development's (OECD) Development Assistance Committee in 2010, making its official transformation from an aid recipient into a donor nation. Korea's development experience contains practical solutions accumulated through trial and error, and its knowledge of successes and failures is a great asset for partner countries to help take on development challenges and promote sustainable growth.

In 2018, continuing to build on its knowledge-based economy, the Korean Ministry of Economy and Finance (MOEF) and the Korea Development Institute (KDI) established the Global Knowledge Exchange and Development Center (GKEDC) to share and transfer knowledge about Korea's 70 years of its development journey. The Center has been designed to implement programs linking the global development agenda with Korea's experiences and to provide practical and applicable knowledge to its partner countries. GKEDC, supported by KDI, Korea's first and premier economic policy think-tank, has collaborated with international organizations and offers knowledge sharing and capacity building programs to development professionals, government officials, policy makers, and academics.
